AUTOPSY 2 EVIDENCE

There is no photo of Sample 1 from the 2nd autopsy.

Photo at handover 09/03/2005, dated 4th Sept 1997 label said preserved, 972147, PAUL HENRY, Campana, fluoridated.

Professor John Oliver stated that there were two independent entries with different codes purporting to be the same FD blood sample. Oliver also said that he read the description from the Met Police that Pepin stated that only one femoral blood sample was taken in the 2nd autopsy. MacLeod moved on and never came back to that point.

Professor Vanezis was refused attendance. There are two different descriptions of the label number and name. If this was genuinely from Henri Paul's body, what happened to the rest of this sample? It was not tested.

The untested sample of genuine Henri Paul blood was used in place of the non-existent Sample 1. Sample 2 results were copied.

It had not been labelled until Judge Bellancourt issued an order for DNA testing on the samples retained at TOXLAB by Pepin. He made it seem that the Gendarmes collected these samples at the same time, but they were in fact collected a week later on February 10th 2005. These were all from the 1st autopsy by Lecomte. They took a blood and liver sample. The police returned and took the remainder in Dec. 2005. In 2006, Pepin stated they had been tested.

The 'FD', Campana sample has the same label as the one given to Paget for DNA testing. The quantity matches Professor Roy Green's description - 3 to 4ml. IT WAS HP1.

It is odd that Pepin was given Sample 2 and not 1.

Pepin stated that it was NOT the sample given to Paget.

I do not think any samples were taken.

XM1 & XM2

Samples were taken from unknown male before Henri Paul's body was brought in from body reception room (not refrigerator).

NUMBER OF SAMPLES

Mules stated 5, but that was the total number.

The 2 XMs were tested and used up.

The 3 genuine Henri Paul samples were never alcohol tested.

Lecomte changed to 5 samples in 2005 when DNA tests were ordered because the two XMs were used up and she was forced to agree with Mules' number.

Lecomte tried to say that she added the 2nd autopsy samples, but that was a lie. However, 2 genuine HP samples were used in the 2nd autopsy. Perhaps this is why she was confused!
